MAYORAL PROCLAMATION OF MANDATORY CURFEW DURING STATE OF EMERGENCY (AMENDED)

WHEREAS, on the 31st day of August, 2008, I proclaimed a curfew for all citizens other than first responders, emergency and relief workers within the City of New Orleans and the Parish of Orleans from eight o'clock p.m. (8:00 p.m.) until six o'clock a.m. (6:00 a.m.) each and every night until the Proclamation is rescinded or amended;

WHEREAS, the City of New Orleans and Parish of Orleans remains under a State of Emergency;

WHEREAS, substantial improvements have been and continue to be made to the infrastructure of the City and Parish permitting more citizens and business owners to return;

WHEREAS, there still remain large areas of the City in which there are no operable street lights, traffic lights, stop signs, or street signs;

WHEREAS, some areas of the City remain sparsely populated as a result of Hurricane Katrina, which along with the lack of street lighting, makes them more difficult to police and more vulnerable to looting and burglaries;

WHEREAS, many areas of the City are well populated, with residents and tourists, creating a critical mass sufficient to deter looting and burglaries, with the exception of late night hours;

WHEREAS, it is necessary to maintain effective anti-looting measures and to make sure that criminal activity does not immediately resume in the aftermath of Hurricane Gustav;

NOW THEREFORE, I, C. Ray Nagin, as Mayor and Chief Executive Officer of the City of New Orleans and the Parish of Orleans, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of Louisiana and the Home Rule Charter, City Code, and laws


of the City of New Orleans, do hereby order and proclaim that the curfew declared by me on August 31, 2008 is amended to provide as follows:


- A. Effective on Saturday, September 6, 2008, citizens are not allowed to be outside on foot or in any vehicle from 2:00 o'clock a.m. (2:00 a.m.) to six o'clock a.m. (6:00 a.m.) in zip codes 70112, 70115, 70116, and 70130 of the City.
- B. The curfew in all other parts of the City shall be from ten o'clock p.m. (10:00 p.m.) to six o'clock a.m. (6:00 a.m.).
- C. Those employees of establishments whose place of employment closes at the curfew hour may have an additional one hour grace period to travel from their place of employment to their place of residence if the employee worked at the establishment until it closed at the curfew hour. Likewise, those employees of establishments whose place of employment opens at six o'clock a.m. (6:00 a.m.) may have an additional hour grace period, from five o'clock a.m. (5:00 a.m.) to travel from their place of residence to their place of employment. These limited exceptions do not extend to patrons and customers of these establishments.

**I DO FURTHER PROCLAIM** that, under those same powers, the remaining provisions in that Mayoral Proclamation of Mandatory Curfew shall remain in full force and effect until specifically amended or rescinded by the Mayor of the City of New Orleans or by other operation of law.

The City Attorney is directed to file this Proclamation promptly in the Office of the Clerk of Court, and with the Office of Emergency Preparedness as soon as is reasonably possible under the circumstances.
